

CS-SUNN is a non-profit making coalition, made up of organizations with a shared vision to transform Nigeria into a country where every citizen has food and is Nutrition-secured. CS-SUNN KWARA State is a coalition of CSOs, comprising NGOs, FBOs, Professional Organizations working in nutrition specific and nutrition sensitive interventions in Kwara State. The Organization formalized its entry into Kwara State in 2018 and was formally inaugurated the same year. CS-SUNN KWARA currently has 22 organizations as registered members. The total coverage area for CS-SUNN KWARA is the sixteen (16) LGAs in Kwara State. CS-SUNN Kwara is committed to having a state where malnutrition is reduced in all its forms.

## IMPACT OF CS-SUNN IN KWARA STATE

- 1 22+ members; CSOs, FBOs, Women Groups and Media
- 2 30+ advocacies conducted. Advocacies led to increased commitment of the government and key stakeholders to increase funding for nutrition, extension of maternity leave and increase multi-sectoral partnership for nutrition and reinstatement of State Committee for Food and Nutrition (SCFN)
- 3 19+ CSOs trained and a nutrition budget core group created with a mandate to track and analyse nutrition budget
- 4 1+ nutrition budget analysis report (2014 – 2018) that showed nutrition funding gaps in Kwara State produced and disseminated
- 5 5+ roundtable meetings with grassroots CBOs and Woman Groups in Oke-Ose Community and Igosun Community to support maternal and child Nutrition.
- 6 CS-SUNN provide technical support to the State for the development of State and Multi-sectoral Plan of Action on Food and Nutrition

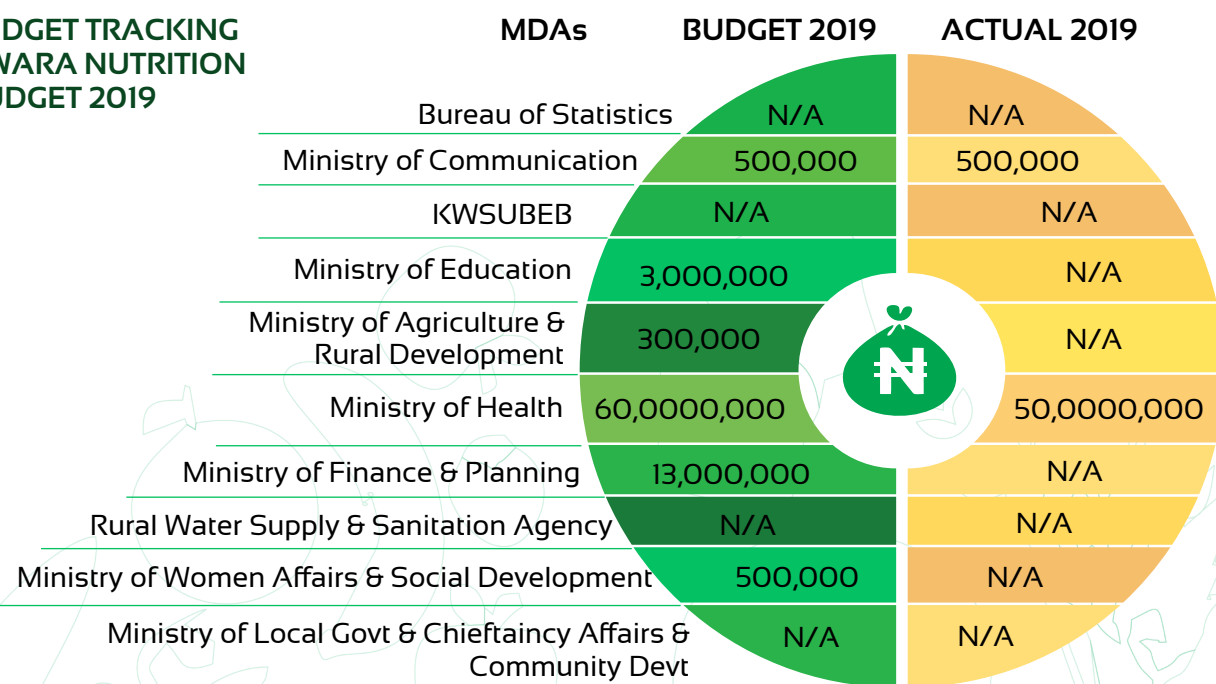

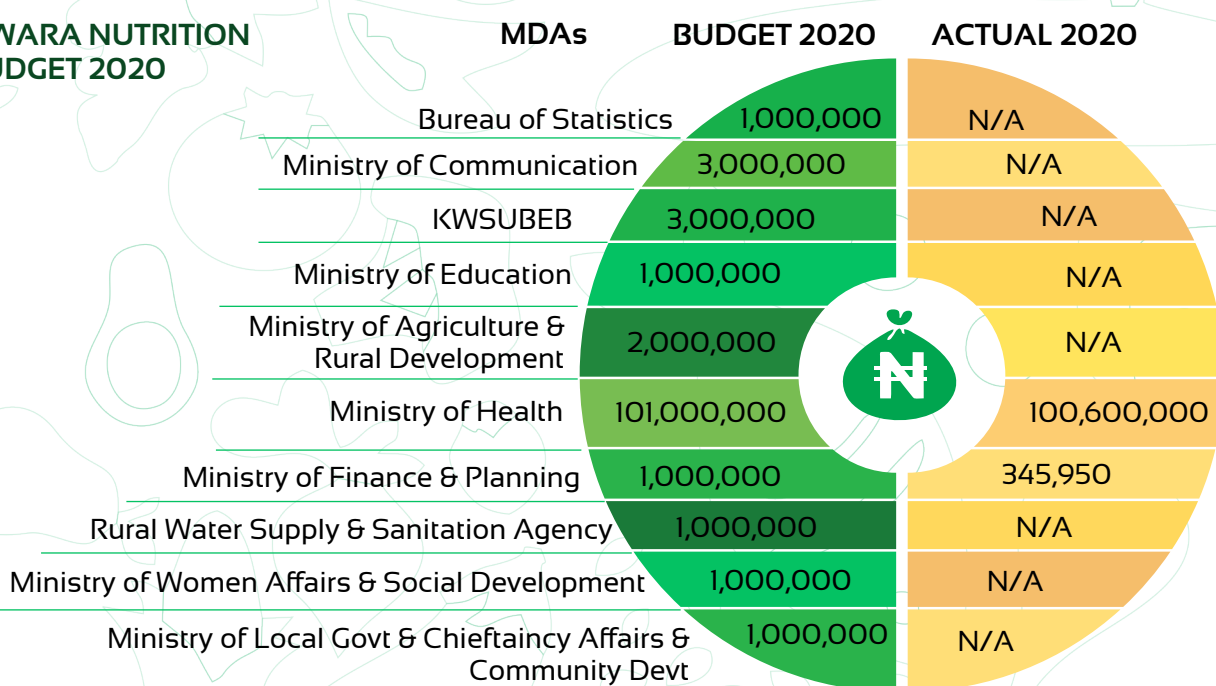

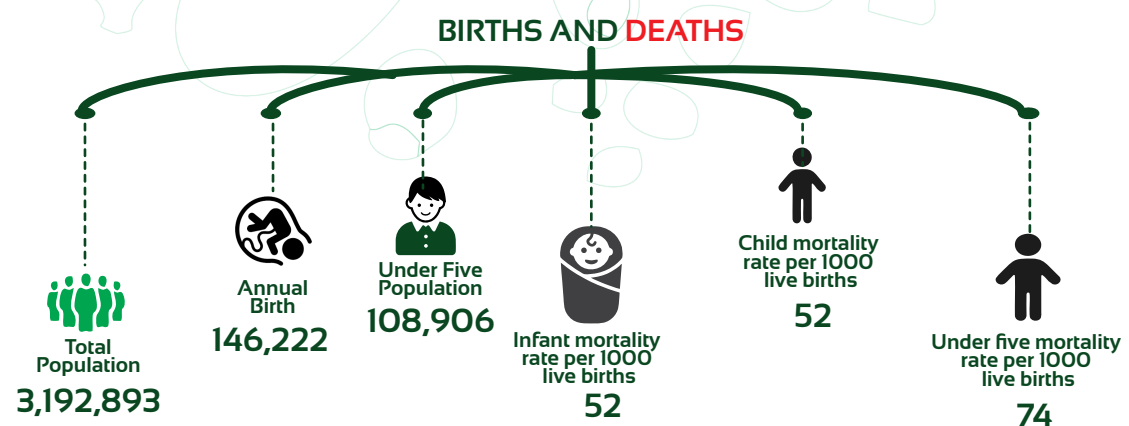
### BUDGET TRACKING KWARA NUTRITION BUDGET 2019



### KWARA NUTRITION BUDGET 2020

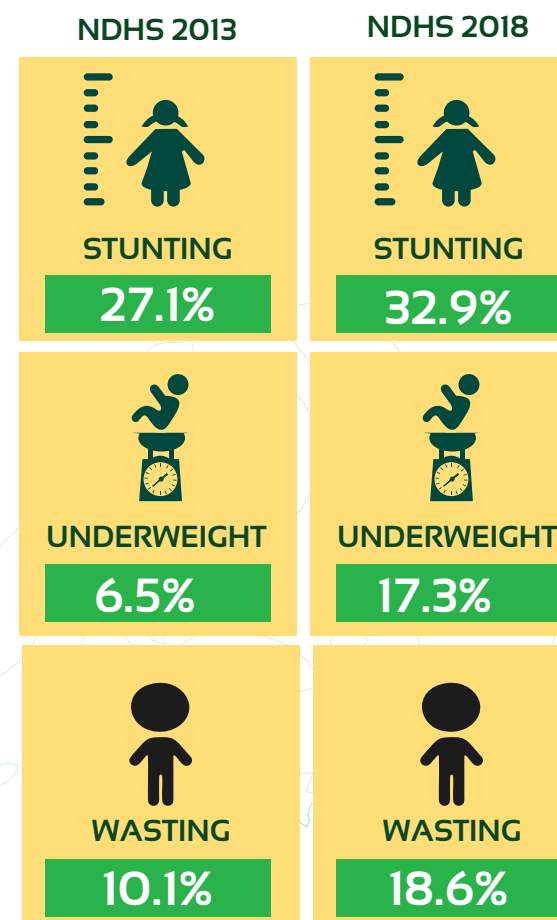
